1. Proper mix within guidelines 49/30 mix social/affordable.

SH POL 5

To promote social integration and the provision of a range of dwelling types in residential developments that would encourage a mix of tenure, particularly in any State funded house building programmes.

SH POL 6

To support the provision of accommodation for older people and for people with disabilities that would allow for independent and semi-independent living in locations that are proximate to town and village centres and services and amenities such as shops, local healthcare facilities, parks, and community centres.

- 2. Greenspace is landscaped appropriately with outdoor exercise equipment, seating, and pathways.
- 3. Ashewood residents' concerns about traffic safety are taken into consideration. This Includes the recent report by Michael Finnegan which includes:
 - Footpaths and kerbing on Ashewood green
 - Additional signage, clearing tree cover (sightlines) and ramps at Ashewood Glen/Drive/Green
 - Traffic tables at junction Ashewood Close/Close/Green, Ashewood Court/Grove/Green
 - Improvements to junction at end of Ashewood Green / Archerstown Wood-Sycamore Drive
 - Pedestrian crossing Ashewood Drive/Hunter's Lane for kids crossing to Brookville (St. Mary's N.S.)
- 4. OPW site belonging to Meath Co Co is developed for a children's playground and a part VIII is initiated asap. How will all this be paid for? One 70 dwelling housing development is conditioned to pay a total of €446,000 in Ashbourne.
- 5. Residents are consulted on main entrance/exit to Archer's Glen and also on their boundaries including any pedestrian/cycling entrances, hedgerows and height of walls.
- 6. No further development is allowed to come through Ashewood from lands zoned to the west of Archer's Glen or in the future to the north of Archer's Glen
- 7. Proper management of estate by Meath County Council, and not Housing agency

We call on Meath County Council to enact bye laws for weight (10t) and number of axles (4+) for heavy goods vehicles (HGV's ex agricultural and rigid vehicles) on the following roads: The L50161 from N2 to R155 and the L1002 Riverstown/Timoole from R152 junction to N2. Both roads are being used excessively by HGVs to avoid queues on main roads and are damaging road surfaces and are a concern for public safety.
