3. Correspondence

- Correspondence issued to The Chief Executive regarding CCTV and the passage of the Roads Bill 2017 was noted by the Committee.
- Correspondence issued to the Dept of Justice regarding the pro-rata inequity of resources to the Meath Division on foot of the letter from the JPC in March and the lack of response to same. The committee agreed that a follow-up letter should issue seeking a response from the Dept of Justice to same.

CS Healy informed of a new garda Station just opened in Wexford town recently and the JPC are invited to view same on a study visit .The Committee agreed that Monday 25th June was a date that would suit the members for same and for Eugene and Fergus to coordinate for numbers attending .The chair of the Wexford JPC should be asked to attend a meeting of the JPC while there to advise the group on what actions the JPC were involved in regarding same.

4. To receive a presentation from the Criminal Assetts Bureau

Pat Clavin gave a presentation to the Committee on the work being carried out by the CAB. The presentation dealt with the following matters:

- In place since 1996
- Seeking information on anyone who appears to be living beyond their means
- Not involved in dispersal of assets confiscated under proceeds of crime legislation
- Meath Division has 8 No Garda Profilers with 8No full investigations in the division
- Whether to current GDPR Regulations will affect the personal data being collected on individuals

The Chair thanked Mr Clavin on his informative presentation and a number of Members raised questions which were answered to their satisfaction.

5. To receive an update from AGS on the 2018 Policing Plan for Co Meath

CS Healy informed that the Plan was now in place and operational with the following key areas to be addressed:

High Visibility Policing:

- Bike Units in Urban areas
- Mobile and Beat patrols/Pubic order patrols at Weekends and events

Crime Prevention:

- High Viz Checkpoints
- Hold 4No Crime Prevention days of Action in all Districts
- Hold a Business crime prevention seminar

Engagement with minorities and other vulnerable groups:

- Continue to Build Trust and confidence with minority groups and with the most vulnerable in our community.
- Host one Open Day in each District HQ and one in Mosney Reception Centre
- Maintain the status of one Community Garda in each Garda Sub-District throughout the Division.







Children and Young People (including child protection)

- All Primary Schools within the Division visited at least once during term.
- All Secondary Schools within the Division visited at least once during term.
- Divisional Protective Services Bureau fully operational

Garda Reserve Management & Utilisation

- Increase the number of Garda Reserve Members available within the Division by 100%.
- Utilise reserve members for major events in the Division e.g. Fairyhouse Easter festival and other Music Festival, Fleadh Ceol etc.
- Ensure approved Training needs are met

Victim Services

- Meet all our obligations to victims as enshrined in legislation and the Victims Directive
- Ensure that a quality policing service is provided to victims throughout the year.
- All members will be aware of the full requirements of the Victims policy and legal obligations.
- Ensure anti social patrols are conducted daily through the Division.
- Ensure Anti Social behaviour is kept to a minimum.
- Ensure Liquor Licensing Inspections are conducted weekly
- Carry out four "Test Purchase of Alcohol operations, per quarter, throughout the Division.
- Greater integration of Roads Policing Unit with Divisional personnel. Joint checkpoints to be a part of normal operations

Missing Persons

- All missing person files are properly completed with appropriate input and that PULSE Data is fully updated.
- Increased awareness among all members of the need to ensure that all MP reports are fully investigated.
- All meetings conducted as per frequency protocol and measures implemented to reduce the risk to missing children
- Ensure all procedures and protocols relating to missing persons are complied implemented.

Major Emergency

- Chair, the North East Major Emergency Co-ordination Group for the current term.
- Ensure the Division has ability to respond effectively to a major emergency and that adequate resources are available to respond robustly.

Event Management

 All major events to be adequately policed and positive outcomes to be achieved in terms of public safety, personal injury and public enjoyment

Burglary

- Reduce the levels of Burglary incidents in 2018
- Increase the detection rates in burglary cases.
- Implement National burglary initiatives

Robbery Incidents

- Ensure that all robbery cases have or are fully investigated and that uniform investigating members are supported .
- Aim to reduce the numbers of Robberies in 2018
- Maintain the Division's Detection rates

Assault Incidents

- Increase uniform patrols at key times/ locations with a view to reducing the incidence of assault.
- Target youth and juvenile crime/anti-social behaviour in business and residential areas
- Increase Garda presence during the night time economy







- Increase our liaison with young persons through sporting clubs and youth groups. Advise/educate on alcohol consumption.
- Advise alcohol licence holders of their responsibilities under relevant legislation
- Specific Public Order Beat Patrols during night time economy.
- Targeted test purchasing and seek assistance of local media in highlighting the dangers and risks attaching to supplying alcohol to minors.

Organised Crime

- Limit the operation and capability of Organised Crime Gangs.
- Specific persons and groups targeted and profiles generated.
- Increase the level of detections for offences relating to drugs and firearms
- Increased referrals to CHIS from District members.
- Increased detection for drugs, firearms, burglary offences...

Sexual offences

- Divisional Protective Services Unit to be established and fully operational
- All sexual crimes fully investigated in a professional compassionate manner without undue delay

Domestic Abuse Intervention

- Appropriate garda policy is applied in every case.
- All Domestic Violence Incidents are reviewed
- All victims of Domestic Violence receive support and feedback from investigating Gardaí
- Divisional Protective Services to review of all domestic investigation where there are children affected by same.

High Visibility Policing

- Reduce deaths and serious injury on our Districts Roads
- Engage in local media campaign
- Road Safety awareness talks conducted in our Schools
- Road Safety Information Stand Display at Public Event at least one event each quarter throughout the Division.

Road Safety

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Traffic Flow Management

• All areas identified with traffic flow issues to be appropriately policed.

Lifesaver Offences Detections

• Increase the detection of lifesaver offences (Speed, mobile phone use, seat belts, intoxicated driving) by 10%

Code of Ethics

- Ensure that 100% of Divisional personnel are trained in the Code of Ethics by end Q2
- All ethics initiatives supported and implemented

Chair Trevor Golden thanked the Chief Super for his Report on the roll-out of the Co Meath Policing Plan .

Members raised the following queries which were responded to by AGS and officials present:

- Increase in drive-offs from Petrol Stations -CPO to visit stations and advise on prevention
- Increase in drunk driving detections with lower age profile noted.

- Large number of cars seized because they are end of life or worthless.
