	<ul> <li>Affordable Purchase Scheme</li> <li>Affordable Rental Scheme</li> </ul>				
	Roll out nationally of Homeless HAP				
	Details of the Chief Executive's Report submitted as part of the Summit process, was outlined, including delivery to date for the period 2015 to present, progress status of Meath County Council's current pipeline direct construction projects, progress status of Approved Housing Body pipeline approved turnkey acquisition projects and indicative programme for obtaining the 2017-2021 targets.
