1.	Minutes of Previous Meeting

	The Members welcomed Cllr. Alan Tobin to the Chair and in turn, the Chair thanked his predecessor Cllr. Joe Fox. Cllr Tobin also took the opportunity to thank the outdoor staff on their work during Storm Ophelia.			
2	To receive the Member's views in respect of Meath County Council's submission on the National Planning Framework and if thought fit, to resolve to attach recommendations to that report. It was agreed prior to the meeting to invite the Full Council to the SPC in order to receive their views on the National Planning Framework. The Members received a detailed presentation from Wendy Bagnall, Senior Executive Planner, on the key points of the National Planning Framework. The Members commended			
	Wendy on the content of the presentation and made the following comments;			





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- Concern at the emphasis on the direction of future population growth away from the East Midlands region.
- Meath should continue to pursue the inclusion of Ashbourne, Ratoath and Dunshauglin in the Metropolitan Area.
- Need to reinforce the message put forward in our submission on the Strategic Issues Paper.
- Need to be stronger in calling for a rail to Navan and a firm commitment for the construction of the Leinster Outer Orbital Route.
- Promotion of Meath as a 'Live/Work/Play' County
- Continued call for a Regional Hospital
- Highlighted the importance of villages and revival of our villages.
- Need for a balance between community and economic development
- Need for major improvements in broadband
- Promotion of educational campus initiative which should also be used for other integrated services
- Essential to look at housing and re-commission buildings which have been idle for sometime
- Highlighted the important role the voluntary sector play in society
- Need to examine where commuters actually work and invest in the infrastructure to those areas
- Concern over the health implications and quality of life caused as a result of commuting
- Need for transport costs to be lowered to encourage public transport
- Need to place an emphasis on Direct Provision
- Need to build and invest in our communities
- Need to plan for 'step-down' living and developments suitable for the older generation
- Need to revitalize Town Centres and incentivize investment in town centres
