4 Statutory Business

4.1 Planning

- 4.1.1 To consider taking in charge the following estates and the making of a declaration that the roads within the estates shall be public roads in accordance with Section 11 Roads Act 1993 and the Planning & Development Act 2000-2014.
 - The Glebe, Kells;
 - Townspark Manor, Kells.

Councillors raised concerns expressed by residents in both estates of outstanding issues that needed to be addressed prior to these estates being taken in charge. Reference was made to a letter submitted by residents in Townspark Manor outlining a number of issues and also to the boundary wall around The Glebe and adjacent to Mill Lane, which residents felt did not comply with the planning permission.

It was agreed to request the Planning Department to prepare a report for the April meeting on the issues identified and to defer decisions in respect of both estates being taken in charge until such a report could be considered.

7 Correspondence

7.1 Correspondence received re. Harvest Walk, Headfort Road, Kells.

This letter had been received on the day of the meeting and the contents were read into the meeting. It concerned the condition of the Harvest Walk, Headfort Road, affecting pedestrian safety, and requested that the footpath be upgraded. It was agreed on the proposal of **Councillor Michael Gallagher** and seconded by **Councillor Sarah Reilly** to refer this correspondence to the Transportation Department for consideration.

8 Any Other Business

8.1 Kells Paid Parking

Kevin Stewart circulated a report, outlining recommended changes to the Kells paid parking charges, as recently agreed with the Chamber of Commerce and local traders. Councillors congratulated the officials of Meath County Council, the Chamber of Commerce and local traders in reaching an agreement. It was unanimously agreed to proceed with the recommended changes and it was confirmed that the changes would take effect as soon as the machines could be re-calibrated. It was also confirmed that a public awareness campaign would be implemented to coincide with the changes.
