



#### **Statutory Budget Meeting** 23<sup>rd</sup> November, 2015 - 2.00p.m. - Council Chamber

 To consider the Draft Budget circulated herewith for the Financial Year on 31<sup>st</sup>. December, 2016.

The Cathaoirleach opened the meeting and he called on the Chief Executive to address the meeting. The Chief Executive outlined that a budget of approximately €101m. was being put before the Council for adoption and that it was prepared in accordance with the various Circulars issued to the Local Authority by the DoECLG, and within the agreed timeframes.

She noted that the Council's decision to retain the Local Property Tax at its current rate had been hugely beneficial, enabling financial provision for:

- An increase of €780k for the maintenance and improvement of Local Authority housing units.
- Increased funding of €345k for homeless services.
- Mobility aids housing grants has increased by €100k to a total budget in 2016 of €1.3m.
- Provision of €350k for the continuation and expansion of the small business support scheme.

It was also explained that notification had been received from the DoECLG confirming that the Council would be allowed additional revenue in 2016 in





compensation for loss of income with regard to the revaluation of the global utilities. The Chief Executive informed that the additional funding would be directed to the Roads Programme. The Chief Executive thanked the Cathaoirleach, the members of the CPG and the elected Councillors for their input into the Draft Budget and recommended the Statutory Budget for adoption.

Fiona Lawless, Head of Finance, presented the details of expenditure across the service divisions A – J as follows:

- Service Division A Housing and Building
- Service Division B Road Transport and Safety
- Service Division C Water Services
- Service Division D Development Management
- Service division E Environmental Services
- Service Division F Recreation and Amenity
- Service Division G Agriculture, Education, Health and Welfare
- Service Division H Miscellaneous Services
- Service Division J Central Management Charges

Following the presentation, the Cathaoirleach thanked the Chief Executive and the Head of Finance for their work in preparing and presenting the budget and particularly for the openness and transparency in the presentation of information to all the Councillors at the Municipal District meetings. He noted that it was the seventh consecutive year of no increase in commercial rates and outlined the importance of increasing the rate base in the county.

The Cathaoirleach referred to a motion submitted by Councillor Wayne Forde at the November meeting, which was referred to the Statutory Budget meeting. As Councillor Forde was not present in the Chamber to propose his motion, the Cathaoirleach proceeded to invite comments from the Councillors.

The main comments and items discussed included:

- The allocation of funding and particularly the allocation of funding from central Government.
- The need for significantly more funding for housing services.
- The costs and issues regarding the Knockharley dump.
- Renewal of the tenant purchase scheme.
- The roadworks programme.
- The lack of control regarding local issues as a result of Better Local Government.
- Safety audits at schools.
- Councillor Darren O' Rourke proposed the scrapping of the Councillors' Discretionary fund and to direct it to a community development fund.
- The need to build on the tourism strategy and on Irish language services.
- The need to focus on adaptation grants for vulnerable households. •





The need to support the community and voluntary sector and the • sporting clubs.

Councillors noted and welcomed:

- The increase in Housing expenditure. •
- No increase in rent or commercial rates. •
- The extension of the Business Support Scheme.

Councillor Wayne Forde proposed a motion that all Councillors would release their discretionary fund to provide funding for the refurbishment of vacant units in the County. With no seconder for the motion, it could not proceed.

2. Meath County Council adopts, for the financial year ending 31<sup>st</sup> December 2016 the Annual Budget set out in Tables A – F.
