All regional finalists will be invited to attend a fashion showcase hosted at the Rediscovery Centre where their outfits will be displayed and judged by professionals in the sustainability and environmental sector.

#### **ABOUT**

The fashion and textile industry is one of the most polluting industries and contributes to 10% of all greenhouse gases. Extending the lifespan of our clothing can reduce the environmental impacts by up 60%.

Relove Fashion is a competition to encourage students to take a deeper look at clothing and to explore creative reuse options such as upcycling, repairs, alterations and mending. It has been created by your local authorities working with the Rediscovery Centre to give you an opportunity to use your clothes design and repair skills and demonstrate your love for making your own fashion statement. It's about creating an outfit you would enjoy wearing.



# WHO CAN APPLY

Competition is open to all secondary level students either in teams or as an individual submission.

# **JUDGING CRITERIA**

Entries shall be marked on the following:

Look and wearability of the outfit	25%
Source of outfit	20%
Steps taken to Repair,	
Remake, Amend & Reimagine	25%
Description of the fabric and	
garment quality	10%
Views on making fashion more sustainable	20%



**PRIZES** 

All regional finalists will receive a school tour and workshop at the Rediscovery Centre.

The **overall winner** will receive a fashion design pack to the value of €1,000 (Including a trophy, tools equipment and mentoring) for your school.



#### **HOW TO ENTER**

To enter students must submit the following by email to their Local Authority Representative (contact details on next page)

- A storyboard detailing the design, materials/clothing used, and the story of their outfits.
- Before and after photos of clothing.
- Brief description of where the clothing was sourced, what steps were taken to upcycle or accessorise the outfit sustainably.
- A description of the fabrics and garment quality.
- Your views on why it is important to make fashion more sustainable taking account of the impacts of textile production and manufacturing.

In the email please also provide:

- Name of school and teacher as the main point of contact.
- If a team submission all the names in the team.
- Contact phone number for your school.
