#### 1 Election of An Cathaoirleach

The Cathaoirleach opened the meeting and reflected on his year as Cathaoirleach, with particular emphasis on the last few months during the Covid-19 crisis. He highlighted the tremendous community response to the crisis and commended the Council on how it has provided leadership during that time. He reflected on the changes that had taken place over the last 12 months, the positive developments which were a priority at the start of his term in office, and also the significant changes enforced by the pandemic. He acknowledged the cooperation of his fellow Councillors in the conduct of Council meetings and the support of the Leas-Chathaoirleach. He made reference to the support that he had from various staff members during his time as Cathaoirleach and thanked the members of the Management Team. Finally he thanked his family for their support over the past year and wished his successor every good wish.

The Chief Executive thanked Councillor Harding for his work and contribution during his time as Cathaoirleach and presented him with an album of images of his time in office.

The Cathaoirleach then invited nominations for the position of Cathaoirleach.





Councillor David Gilroy was proposed for the position of Cathaoirleach by Councillor Brian Fitzgerald and seconded by Councillor Nick Killian.

Councillor Gerry O'Connor informed the meeting that the Fine Gael group will not be proposing a candidate and hoped that the position of Cathaoirleach would not be contested, drawing parallels to what happened 100 years previously at the first Council Meeting following the 1920 local elections.

Councillor Joe Bonner was proposed for the position of Cathaoirleach by Councillor Joe Bonner and seconded by Councillor Ronan Moore.

**Councillor David Gilroy** was declared elected as Cathaoirleach of the Council and assumed the Chair.

The newly elected Cathaoirleach addressed the meeting, thanked the members for giving him this honour and looked forward to working with all members and the Executive over the coming 12 months. He referenced the first Council meeting following the 1920 local elections and connections that he had to that Council, through his grandfather.

#### 2 Election of the Leas Chathaoirleach

The Cathaoirleach invited nominations for the position of Leas Chathaoirleach.

**Councillor Aisling Dempsey** was proposed for the position of Leas Chathaoirleach on the proposal of **Councillor Tommy Reilly** and seconded by **Councillor Paul McCabe**.

**Councillor Ronan Moore** was proposed for the position of Leas Chathaoirleach on the proposal of **Councillor Joe Bonner** but this nomination was declined by Councillor Moore.

As no further candidates were nominated, **Councillor Aisling Dempsey** was declared elected as Leas Chathaoirleach of Meath County Council.

The newly elected Leas-Chathaoirleach addressed the meeting and thanked members for their support. She reflected on the events of the last three months and acknowledged the voluntary work across many communities in the county. During this time, people have had to evolve their lives and use technology and alternatives to do their jobs. She did think that now was an opportunity for the role of Cathaoirleach and Leas Chathaoirleach to also evolve, especially the use of technology in linking communities and the work of the Council.

**Councillor Edward Fennessy** made an intervention on the centenary of the 1920 local elections and the first meeting of Meath County Council, following those elections. That Council passed its first resolution, which was a refusal to recognise the authority of Dublin Castle and instead recognising the authority of Dail Eireann. He linked the events of 100 years ago to the present and the journey of recovery that the country faces in the context of the global pandemic and its impact on Irish society and the economy.





The out-going Cathaoirleach and Leas-Chathaoirleach, Councillor Gillian Toole, both congratulated the incoming office-holders. Councillor Toole informed the meeting that she had donated the Leas-Chathaoirleach's allowance to local causes in the Dunshaughlin area.

The following members also conveyed messages of congratulations to the Cathaoirleach and Leas-Cathaoirleach: Councillors Ronan Moore; Sarah Reilly; Gerry O'Connor; Mike Bray; Joe Fox; Eugene Cassidy; and Joe Bonner.

The Cathaoireach gave the floor to **Councillor Brian Fitzgerald** who addressed the issue of the centenary of the first meeting of Meath County Council following the local elections of 1920. He paid tribute to the men and women that have served on the Council in that time and spoke of the work and achievements of County Councils across the country over the last 120 years and the significant improvements that Meath County Council has introduced, in particular, to modernise the county and to improve living standards.

The Cathaoirleach thanked Councillors for their contributions on the centenary and due to time constraints agreed to resume the discussion during the Ordinary Council Meeting.
