Meath County Council Arts Grants, Awards & Bursaries Schemes 2020 Update

Welcome to the July edition of the Meath Arts Office Newsletter. As many of you are aware we had to postpone the closing date for all our Arts Grants, Awards & Bursaries Schemes due to Covid19.

We are now happy to announce a new closing date of **Thursday August 20th 2020 at 1pm** for the following schemes;

- Annual Arts Grants Scheme
- Community Arts Award
- Festival Grant Scheme
- Professional Artists Development Fund
- Tyrone Guthrie Centre Regional Bursary Award

And **Thursday September 24th 2020 at 1pm** for the School Musical Instrument Purchase Scheme.

Unfortunately there will be no Drama League of Ireland Bursary awards this year as the DLI Summer School has been cancelled due to Covid19.

As many circumstances have changed, individuals or organisations who have already submitted an application are now required to email the Arts Office confirming the event, festival or project for which funding was sought is still going ahead in 2020. KELLS PRINTING PRESS

In 2016 an intact Victorian printing works of national significance, consisting of 5 printing presses, type trays, galleys, woodblock and extensive paper archive was discovered in the town of Kells. Through a voluntary community effort led by Mark Smith and the Sawmills Studio this important Kells Printing Press collection has been gifted by its benefactor to the people of Kells. Since that time the MCC Arts & Heritages Offices have been working with them to conserve and restore this valuable collection with the objective of establishing Kells Printing Press Studios and Ireland's first centre for Typography. Pictured here is one of the first restored presses on which the poem *Home* by Francis Ledwidge was the first test print.

Included in the collection are hundreds of posters for events - concerts, raffles, auctions, sports days and Ballroom Dances in the Courthouse Kells. MEATH COUNTY COUNCIL WRITER IN RESIDENCE 2020

Meath County Council is pleased to announce that author Nicola Cassidy has been appointed as Writer in Residence for 2020. The residency runs from June-December and will be managed by Meath County Council Library Service.

Nicola Cassidy writes historical fiction and has published three novels. She is also a script writer, blogger and spoken word poet. Her first novel *December Girl*, set in Meath's Boyne Valley was published in 2017 by Bombshell Books. Her second novel *The Nanny at Number 43*, published by Poolbeg Press, was set in Drogheda and featured scenery and characters from Meath. Her third novel *Adele*, is a bio-fictional account of stage star Adele Astaire. Her forthcoming fourth novel is due for publication in November.

Nicola will focus on researching and writing her fourth novel over the summer months. She has also been granted a week's residential stay in the Tyrone Guthrie Centre as part of the residency. In the autumn, Nicola will work with book clubs, schools and emerging writers. She will also host a series of workshops on blogging, podcasting and YouTube.

Arts Council announces expanded Bursary Award across all art forms

The Arts Council has welcomed increased government funding of €20m that brings its annual budget to €100m.

The additional €20 million was announced on June 16th by Minister for Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht, Josepha Madigan TD.

The announcement recognises the significant challenges facing the art sector arising from the COVID-19 emergency.

Recent analysis from the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform identified ‘arts & entertainment’ as one of the sectors most affected by the COVID-19 shutdown.

Arts Council Director, Maureen Kennelly said, ‘Our painters, poets, dancers, musicians, actors and filmmakers show us who we are. We know that this has been an extremely worrying time for people across the industry but today’s news will come as a major reassurance to the public, and to people within the arts sector, that the central place of stories, images, music in Irish life is clearly understood and cherished. We look forward to continuing to work with the government to realise the extraordinary ambition of this rich seam of Irish life’.

The Arts Council’s Music, Opera, and Traditional Arts Bursary Awards are now open for applications. Other awards that are now also open for application include the Festivals Investment Scheme, and bursary awards in the fields of arts participation, architecture, dance, film, literature, circus, theatre, and more.
