|      | ■ R. Collins provided a presentation on the development of the new Corporate Plan for Meath County Council for the period 2019-2024, including reference to the consultation process. As the Plan is to be adopted by Full Council at the December meeting, any submissions were requested to be forwarded as soon as possible. It was agreed to circulate the NOAC Review on Corporate Plans to members for their information |
| 4.   | To Receive an Update on the Scheme of Priority for Affordable Dwelling Purchase Arrangements   |
|      | <ul> <li>D. Jones provided a summary of the content of the Scheme of Priority for Affordable Dwelling<br/>Purchase Arrangements, and the process to date in its adoption at the May full Council Meeting.</li> </ul>   |





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|      | <ul> <li>Subsequent to same, the Department has advised that the Minister is not in a position to approve the Scheme due to the extent of the kilometer radius applied in the order of priority in respect of education and employment (300km). It is the view of the Department that such a radius removes any capacity for prioritisation, and is therefore inconsistent with the legislation on the matter</li> <li>Discussion followed, and it was the consensus of the members present that the rationale that informed the decision on the km radius remains valid, and that the maximum feasible radius should apply, with 120 km suggested. Liaison to take place with Department on the acceptance or otherwise of this revised radius. Matter to be decided upon at the next meeting of the Committee</li> </ul> |

|      | "That this Council writes to the Minister for Justice and Equality, Charlie Flanagan TD, and to the Minister of State for Justice at the Department of Justice and Equality with special responsibility for Equality, Immigration, and Integration, David Stanton TD, calling for the immediate closure of Meath-based Direct Provision Centres and instead, offer residents suitable community-based accommodation and services for children and families"  |
|      | ■ Cllr Ronan Moore detailed the background and spirit of the Notice of Motion, and advised, that in discussion with Cllr O' Rourke, the Motion to be amended to remove reference to the immediate closure of Meath based direct provision centres, and to call for the implementation of the recommendations of the Working Group that reported to Government on improvements and supports to asylum seekers (McMahon Report 2015). Furthermore, support to be given to the current Working Group that is examining alternatives to direct provision   |

|      | "In the interest of fairness & transparency, the Meath County Council housing allocation list will be numbered. If necessary, separate lists will be numbered to include family unit types, health need, Disability and so on as appropriate"  |
