How to Train Your Dragon is also an award-winning DreamWorks film franchise. She is an ambassador for the National Literacy Trust, a trustee for World Book Day and a founder patron of the Children's Media Foundation. Gemma is a Dublin based artist, about to release her first book Caoilte Caillte sa Mhuséam this year. After studying architecture Gemma went on to study illustration and art and now enjoys creating workshops for young people. Gemma ran a youth art workshop on Cuffe Street in the community centre up until the Covid crises. Art, people and community development are her main passions. Kieran Fanning

Kieran Fanning, from County Meath, is a primary school teacher and author for children. He has written a series of interactive puzzle adventures called Code Crackers. The Black Lotus was published in 2015 and is about a group of time-travelling ninjas. Irish Fairy Tales, Myths and Legends is his most recent book, and features ancient tales of the Tuatha Dé Danann, Cúchulainn, Fionn Mac Cumhaill, and many more. For 3rd class upwards.



Johnny Magory



Author Emma-Jane Leeson brings us three workshops. Two on Wildlife and Heritage that involve reading 2 of her books then discussing the wildlife within them. She plays the tin whistle for children to dance and talk about the heritage around Fleadh Cheoils. For junior infants to 2nd class. The other workshop is a Writing Workshop. It is for children aged 8-12 and explains the basics around story writing, practices some mindfulness and then approximately 20 minutes of free-writing.

Oisin McGann

Oisín McGann is one of Ireland's most prolific and best-known writer-illustrators, producing books for all ages of reader. He is the author of the Mad Grandad books, Headbomz: Wreckin' Your Head and novels such as Race the Atlantic Wind, The Gods and Their Machines and The Wildenstern Saga. He is also the illustrator of Jason Byrne's Onion O'Brien books. These two autism-friendly illustration sessions are suitable for all ages.

Mara is a performance storyteller, drawing on her rich, dual Kenyan/Scottish cultural heritage, creating worlds that explore contemporary issues through legend, myth and fantasy. With her inimitable colourful and physical style, she takes audiences on journeys of wonder, magic and mystery. She has performed and led workshops in over 20 countries and is passionate about sharing the beauty and transformational power of story with all ages. For junior infants upwards.

Nicola uses photographs to tell the true stories behind the books. For 5th /6th class.

Paul O'Flynn



Go, Johnny, Go! is the first in a new series from Gill Books and Paul O'Flynn that showcases Ireland's brilliant sporting heroes. This book is all about Johnny Sexton and is written in accordance with the guidelines from the Dyslexia Association of Ireland. It will appeal to all sports fans and reluctant readers. With Paul's expertise as a radio presenter, News and Sport reporter, this book is sure to inspire young readers! For 1st class upwards.

Tom Palmer

A session on refugees and war. When people arrive in a new country – having escaped dangerous and sometimes deadly events – they are sometimes met with kindness, sometimes not. In these two talks, Tom speaks about how reading and writing about refugees and war has helped him work out what he thinks. His books After the War, Over the Line, D-Day Dog and Armistice Runner feature children and adults whose lives are changed forever by armed conflict. For 5th/6th class.
