A Chara,

I wish to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 23rd July 2020 concerning the construction of The Boyne Greenway Drogheda to Mornington, providing both pedestrian and cycleway linkage from Drogheda Town in County Louth to Mornington Village in County Meath.

The lands related to the Greenway straddle the jurisdictions of both Louth and Meath County Councils, with the substantive lands located in County Meath. In this regard and in accordance with the Local Government Act 2001 the two authorities entered into a Section 85 Agreement with Meath County Council acting as the lead in the function of providing the Boyne Greenway.

The NDP and RSES fully support and promote investment in and development of an integrated network of greenways the advantages of which include *inter alia* an improved quality of life, alternative sustainable modes of transport, healthy communities, economic opportunities and potential for increased cycling tourism both in the local and wider area. The delivery of Greenways, providing for pedestrian and cycle linkages is further supported in numerous government policy documents including 'A Strategy for the Future Development of National and regional Greenways', and the 'National Cycle Policy Framework'.
