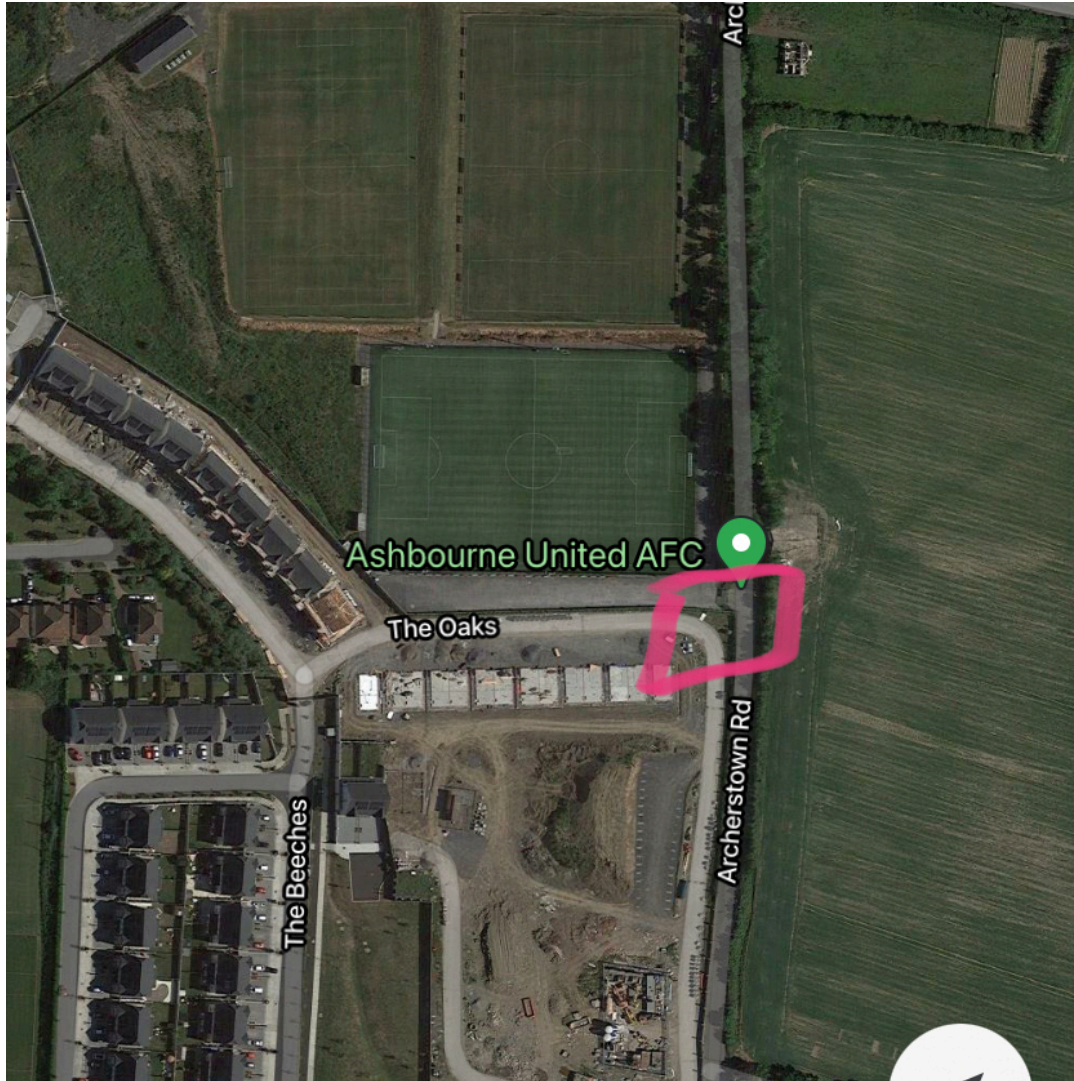
5 Notice of Question
