All families are welcome to the Book Clinic, regardless of ability, need or barriers to reading. Every child leaves the Book Clinic with their own individual Book Prescription and a copy of Children's Books Ireland's Reading Guide

Each Book Doctor consultation will be 10 minutes in duration. If you have more than one young reader who would like to meet the Book Doctor please book one 10-minute consultation per child.

Music Generation's choir for young people began online during the Covid-19 pandemic. Since then, it has grown to comprise 44 young people who meet weekly to rehearse in two venues in Navan and Ashbourne as Meath Children's Choir and Meath Youth Choir.

Their repertoire is a mix of contemporary songs, music from around the world, choral classics and Irish songs. They receive a musical training, develop confidence and social skills, and love their choir games, actions, and workshops!



Their first performance was a video recording of Bóinn, The River Goddess, for Cruinniú na nÓg 2021, as part of the national Songs for Our Children Project.






What is creativity?
Why do some people seem to have loads and others very little?
Can you learn to be more creative?

This Cruinniú residency sets out to explore the five creative habits of mind (also called habits of learning) through writing and story-making. Those habits (imagination, inquisitiveness, collaboration, persistence and discipline) are the building blocks needed for well-rounded creative thinking. They are also a great help in changing the way we talk about art in particular. The more you see creativity as a set of skills, the more you realise they can be learned and also, the more you realise you already have strengths!

Over five sessions, we will combine individual and collective work, focusing on a habit per session. The project will leave children feeling more aware of their strengths and more confident in their progress. It will also equip the teacher(s) involved with useful tools to continue this important conversation.

This tactile project is the cat's whiskers! Create pompoms using the templates and yarn included and turn them into cute feline friends with all the accessories in the pack. Just don't let a real puss get hold of your creation; imagine all the fun they'd have unravelling your hard work! Pompom, paws, whiskers, purrfect!

Kids will be sew pleased when they see these super sloths! These are a great introduction to sewing for budding stitchers. Each one is constructed from precut felt pieces, and children will stitch them together, fill them up with stuffing, and then add a ribbon to hang them up. Stitch, make, design and display!

This will be a multidisciplinary, immersive, inclusive and sensory theatre experience which will tour later in the year. BÓINN-THE RIVER GODDESS

AN ANIMATED VIDEO



'Bóinn - The River Goddess' is a short animated video. The song was composed in 2020 as part of the Songs for Our Children Project which aimed to create a body of songs which are child-friendly, and which pass on the unaccompanied and ornamented singing styles of the Irish song tradition. This song, composed by Meath singer Róisín Ní Ghallóglaigh is about the Boyne River and tells of its history, mythology and geography.

The animated video combines the visual aspects of the song with natural soundscapes and follows the Goddess as she makes her way across the county from her source in Kildare to where she reaches the sea.

The combat techniques will be taught by professional stunt man Jay Cosgrave in a safe and controlled manner creating a challenging and fun experience.

Jay Cosgrave is currently teaching stage combat at the Lir Academy of Dramatic Arts and Technological University Dublin.

Act Out Youth Theatre was established in October 2017 with a remit to create quality theatre experiences with young people (13+) in the Meath area. They provide an annual programme of activities, responding to the needs and interests of the young people, and pride themselves on their ethos of accessibility, diversity and inclusion.
