It was agreed that councillors would submit eligible nominees and the event would take place in Trim, following the May monthly meeting.

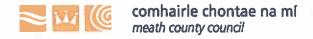
4.2 Transportation

4.2.1 To receive an update on works completed/ planned within Trim Municipal District.

The report had been circulated in advance and matters raised by councillors included:

- Requested that the condition of the King and Queen statues be assessed, including their visibility due to the number of trees around them, and queried if they could be lit up.
- Welcomed surfacing works on Bridge Street.
- Queried whether there were concerns regarding the structure of the bridge due to the vegetation growing – it is planned to do works including the removal of overgrowth and vegetation and assess its condition.
- Queried whether the level of Japanese Knotweed was increasing or decreasing

 no new locations have been submitted and the treatment programme
 continues at known locations, with this to be eradicated in 3-4 years.
- Referred to flooding on footpaths following heavy rain location details were requested.





- A discussion took place on the suitability of providing a bin in the Porchfields, with the majority expressing opposition to a permanent bin being provided.
- Referred to the need for a tree survey, where trees are blocking the view of
 the castle, and the possibility of planting trees at alternative locations to
 replace any removed. This was agreed on the proposal of Councillor Joe Fox
 and seconded by Councillor Noel French.

The minutes were noted.

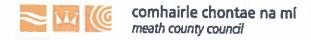
8 Correspondence

- 9.1.1 Requested that a letter of thanks issue to Oliver Carey, following his recent retirement.
- 9.1.2 Requested that a letter issue to the Department of Education and Skills requesting an update on the former school buildings on Patrick Street, Trim and in Kildalkey.
- 9.1.3 Invited councillors to attend a book launch by Councillor Seán Drew, Cathaoirleach on 16th April on the 850th Anniversary of the grant of Meath to Hugh De Lacey, which is being sponsored by Trim Tourism Network.
- 9.1.4 Requested that correspondence from Trim Tourism Network regarding a Christmas event be included on the May agenda it was requested that the correspondence be forwarded to the meeting administration team.
- 9.2 Councillor Trevor Golden raised the following issues:
 - 9.2.1 Proposed that the council engage with the OPW with regard to their plans for the Town Hall and the joint delivery of public toilet facilities – this was seconded by Councillor Joe Fox.
 - 9.2.2 Suggested that the gate entrance to the Porchfields, opposite the King and Queen statues, be widened to improve access it was agreed to check this.
 - 9.2.3 Queried if railings can be provided on the other side of the river under the bridge from the town to prevent access to the river.
- 9.3 Councillor Ronan Moore raised the following issue:
 - 9.3.1 Queried the period of time in which the contractor must return to address any issues that arise following works in the Porchfields, e.g. at Watergate Bridge, the grit has worn away.
