Council Meetings

As agreed at the Protocol Meeting in May, the Council AGM will take place in person in the Solstice Arts Centre on 13th June 2022. The Council meeting will continue on a hybrid basis in the Solstice Arts Centre for the June Council meeting.

It is intended that all MD meetings in June will be undertaken in hybrid format.

<u>Ukrainian Refugees</u>

Responsibility for sourcing accommodation for refugees lies with the International Protection Accommodation Service (IPAS), which comes under the remit of the Dept. of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth. The Council has been providing assistance to IPAS in this regard. To date (1st June 2022), a total of 350 Ukrainian Refugees have been accommodated at the Council's Emergency Rest Centre at Mullaghboy, on a temporary basis and all have been relocated to other accommodation facilities within the county.

Volunteer Recognition Event



Meath County Council with the support of the Dept. of Community Development and Charities hosted an event to acknowledge the enormous contribution made by Meath volunteers during the Covid-19 pandemic and to thank them for their invaluable work and support during a very difficult time.

The event was emceed by Rory O'Connor from Rory's Stories and

featured videos from Minister Joe O'Brien and anecdotes from several people throughout the county that shared their experience of the volunteer assistance that they had received and what it meant to them at that time.

A total of 245 individual Volunteers were recognised at the event, receiving a letter of thanks from An Taoiseach, Micheál Martin, along with a commemorative badge designed by Nora Doe of St. Paul's NS, Sligo as part of a school art competition.

Climate Action

Air Quality Project Trim:



Meath County Council has signed the contract for the Trim Air Quality Project with Trilateral Research.

In attendance were Meath County Council Cathaoirleach Cllr. Sean Drew, Cathaoirleach of Trim Municipal District, Cllr. Joe Fox with Meath County Council officials and representatives from Trilateral Research.

Meath County Council is commencing the project through the Department of Rural & Community

Development's Digital Innovation Fund to monitor the air quality in Trim over a 20-month period. Air quality sensors will be installed in a number of locations in Trim, with a dashboard subsequently being made available for the general public to view real-time data from the sensors.

This project will assist Meath County Council to monitor and improve air quality if required and help raise awareness of the importance of air quality. The Council also hopes to add additional social impact by including school children in the project.

This project ties in with Trim Decarbonisation Zone, to reduce emissions within the town by 51% by 2030 in line with national targets, and Global Goals for Cities – the European URBACT project that Trim is involved in to localise the Sustainable Development Goals. In addition to air quality monitoring, the Trim Air Quality project aims to facilitate additional data sets such as weather data and traffic data.

Going forward, the air quality data collected will inform the provision of sustainable solutions to improve air quality and reduce emissions within Trim and inform the community of the air quality in Trim town.

Green Coast Award Mornington

At a ceremony held at Curracloe Beach in County Wexford on the 20th May, An Taisce as the coordinating body for the awards, announced that Mornington Beach was one of 62 areas nationally which were awarded a Green Coast Award for 2022.

The Green Coast Award recognises beaches for their clean environment, excellent water quality and natural beauty. An important aspect of the Green Coast Awards is the involvement of Clean Coasts groups and in this regard the Beach Management Committee are the associated Group for Mornington beach.

Rubbish Film Festival



Coláiste na Mí, Loreto Navan, Coláiste na hInse, Ashbourne Community School and Coláiste Clavin took prizes at the Meath County Council Rubbish Film Festival at the Solstice Arts Centre on Wednesday 4th May.

The judges had a difficult task choosing winners from many great entries from TY students across the County, who each took part in Createschool movie making workshops with an environmental theme.

PickerPals



Angela and Patrick, the founders of 'Pickerpals' continued their visits to Meath schools with a visit to Bellewstown National School for a morning of fun and games, with their strong Anti Litter message and 'Cloak of Howth', made from marine litter.

The Meath County Council supported initiative was rolled out to 88 classes in Meath in the past year. The children have been working hard all year, taking turns with the Pickerpals pack, collecting litter in their local environment and reporting back to the class.

The programme was delivered to 1,300 classes across in Ireland this school year, where the participating schools, kids and families cleaned up 150 tonnes of litter – which is the equivalent or 75 giraffes according to the Bellewstown kids!

More classes will be included in the programme next year.

Call for Expressions of Interest for Purchase of Lands and/or Turnkey Houses – Social and Affordable Housing

A call for Expressions of Interest was advertised on 18th February for uncommenced residential developments and land for social and affordable housing. Proposals will be evaluated as they are received. Both calls for Expressions of Interest are open until the end of the year. Proposals received will be evaluated, and if deemed suitable, will then form the basis of an application for funding under the Affordable Housing Fund to achieve affordability. Refurbishment Projects

- St Francis Park (€3,771,374) Departmental approval has been received to proceed to Tender Stage. A total of 5 No. contractors have been shortlisted for the tender stage of the scheme. Estimated start date onsite is Q3 2022
- Alverno Court Refurbishment (€4,150,329) Refurbishment works commenced on site on 3rd August 2021 and will be completed across five phases. Phase 2 and 3 of the works commenced on 14th March 2022 and the tenants from Phase 2 and 3 of the works have been decanted to facilitate these works. The scheme also consists of the demolition of 2 No. additional units which are to be rebuilt over the duration of the 5 phases.

Housing Adaptation Grant Schemes for Older People and People with a Disability

A total of 92 applications for Grant funding to the value of €681,791 were approved at the end of 2021. These approvals were carried forward into this year's budget as works will not be completed until 2022. A further 173 applications to the value of €1,150,822.00 have been approved to date in 2022. The total value for the 265 applications that have been approved to date equates to €1,183,2613

Community Development

Local Community Development Committee (LCDC)

The next meeting is scheduled for Friday 27th May and will receive any new updates.

LEADER Programme 2014-2022

The next LAG meeting is scheduled for Friday 27th May where the LAG will receive updates on EOI's received and consider any projects recommended by the IEC.

Comhairle na n'Óg

Work is continuing on the new facility locator app called 'Tír na nÓg' developed by Meath Comhairle na nÓg members. Initial testing of app is due to take place in early summer.

Joint Policing Committee

The Joint Policing Committee "Subcommittees" resumed their meetings in May 2022, and each agreed on work plan actions to achieve the objectives set out in the adopted Strategic Plan 2021 – 2026.

The 3 Subcommittees remain the same and met on the following dates: Public Order & Antisocial Behaviour – 12^{th} May Road Safety & Improved Driver Behaviour – 16^{th} May Community Safety & Crime Prevention – 20^{th} May

The main Joint Policing Committee held their May meeting in the Solstice Arts Centre, Navan on 23rd May.

NBP

Extensive work is now progressing for the Drogheda Deployment Area with works taking place in multiple areas to complete the Eir Make Ready portion of the work. NBI contractor is commencing in the coming weeks on their own underground work while fibre stringing on poles has already commenced.

SIRO

SIRO are rolling out their network in 4 additional towns in Meath- Stamullen, Enfield, Kells and Duleek over the coming months. Work has already commenced in these towns but will not be ready for residents to get connected until late 2022 or early 2023.

Broadband Connection Points

Microsoft Dreamspace are launching a new initiative in the BCPs with a pilot running at iDesk Cormeen (Cormeen Sports Complex). Local schools will be invited to an open day on the 14th June to learn more about the Dreamspace programme. Meath Libraries and Microsoft will support the project with laptops and programmable microbit devices for the pupils to use.

The Community Grant Scheme

The closing date for submission of applications in the re-advertised scheme was Friday 13th of May. 93 new applications were received and are being assessed.

Schools Pride of Place Gardening Scheme

Applications for the scheme closed on Thursday 7th April, 41 schools applied for the scheme. 20 of the schools have received Herb Patch kits. Judging will begin in May.

Pride of Place Initiative

The Pride of Place Initiative is open for applications until Friday 27th May. Categories remain the same as 2021. Judging is due to take place during June, July & August.

Carranstown Grant Scheme

30 applications received by the closing date and are being assessed for discussion at the next meeting of the Committee scheduled for Friday 17th June 2022.

Yellow Flag Programme

Community section has collaborated and secured a place for Scoil Mhuire, Navan under this 2-year programme which will commence from September. The programme works with the students, teachers and parents to build intercultural understanding, fostering connections with members of the local travelling community and migrants and develop integration initiatives to ensure the school becomes a yellow flag school at the end of the programme.

Meath Age Friendly programme

Meath Age Friendly hosted the national Older Persons 2-day convention in Knightsbrook Hotel, Trim which had been deferred since 2019 due to Covid. Over 150 persons from across the country attended both days. Various speakers and workshops were organised which linked into the convention theme "Live Well Be Well".

CLÁR

Nine applications were submitted to the department which are currently being assessed.

ORIS

Closing date for submission of applications to the department was 25th May with 3 applications submitted under measure 2 and one submitted under measure 3.

Town and Village Streetscape Enhancement Scheme 2022

This measure is to improve the visual appearance of the urban streetscape making them attractive to live, work and do business in. The criteria has changed for this year and the measure will support a project proposal for one town/village with a population up to 15k. Eligible works include painting, murals, signage replacement, shopfront improvement, lighting and canopies with funding at a rate of 80% for works up to €100k. Projects to be submitted to the department for approval by July 1st.

Co-operation Ireland Pride of Place awards

The deferred 2021 Co-operation Ireland Pride of Place awards were held in person and livestreamed from Killarney on May 16th. Three groups had been entered with Athboy Development Forum being awarded first place in their category.

Community Response Forum Ukrainian refugees

The response forum, which is coordinated by the Community Section, continues to meet on a regular basis to ensure there is a co-ordinated response to assist with the needs of Ukrainian families entering the county.
