1.1 Confirmation of minutes of Ordinary Meeting held on 10th May 2022.



4 Statutory Business

4.1 Planning

4.1.1 To receive the Chief Executive's Report in accordance with Part XI of the Planning & Development Act 2000–2021 and Part VIII of the Planning & Development Regulations 2001–2021 on the proposed development which will consist of - The construction of linear walkways throughout the area, installation of a skateboard park installation of a pedestrian footbridge linking areas either side of the river, installation of public lighting throughout the site, upgrading of roadside boundary treatment, construction of a riverside board walk to link to Churchfields Housing Estate and landscaping throughout the site. Location: Killegland, Ashbourne, Co Meath. (P822007).

Fiona Fallon, Senior Executive Officer, Community Department outlined the Part 8 process, in terms of the consideration of the Chief Executive's report and to accept, amend or reject the recommendations within six weeks. If it is accepted, no further action is required. If it is to be amended or rejected, a Notice of Motion would need to be brought to either the July or a specially convened municipal district meeting within six weeks of receipt of the report and detail provided of the nature of/reason for the amendment or rejection.

Following a short discussion, where a number of concerns were raised in relation to the boardwalk, it was agreed that a related Notice of Motion, requesting an amendment, would be brought to the July meeting for agreement.

4.2 Transportation

4.2.1 To receive a Progress Report on works undertaken/planned for Ashbourne Municipal District.

The report had been circulated in advance and a further update provided at the meeting.





Matters raised by councillors included:

- Requested that red road markings be provided at Donaghmore church.
- Queried if works were complete at Milltown bridge this was confirmed.
- Queried if the Meta grants were still available for signage in playgrounds.
- Queried if signage and/or bollards were planned following the removal of trailers at Ashbourne Retail Park – bollards are to be provided.
- Welcomed the works on the cycleway on the Dublin Road.
- Referred to the ongoing issues of the locks being broken to access the beach at Gormanston – more substantial measures will be considered.
- Referred to the lack of public lighting in the middle of Mountainview,
 Stamullen and queried if the MD Allocation Scheme can be used towards the funding of lights.

6 Notice of Motion

6.1 Submitted by Councillor Conor Tormey





"I call on Meath County Council to erect bus stops in Greenogue on the R125 Ashbourne – Swords, bus route 197."

<u>Supporting information subject to the motion being proposed, seconded and considered:</u>

Please note, under the Dublin Transport Authority Act 2008 (as amended), one of the principal functions of the National Transport Authority is to secure the provision of public transport infrastructure (being infrastructure constructed or provided, or proposed to be constructed or provided in connection with the provision of public passenger transport services, and which includes bus stop infrastructure). Accordingly, the provision of bus stops is a matter for the National Transport Authority (NTA) and the relevant bus operators in the first instance. Meath County Council does not have a direct responsibility for the provision of such infrastructure, our primary function in relation to bus stops is the approval (or revocation) of stopping locations for licensed bus transport services (Section 85 of the Road Traffic Act). Under the Roads Act 1993 (as amended), Meath County Council may, as part of the maintenance and construction of roads, provide such infrastructure as is necessary to facilitate public transport and public transport users.

Following a previous assessment, which identified a requirement for off-line bus stops at this location and associated infrastructure, we understand the Authority currently has no plans to install public transport infrastructure in Greenogue, nor to provide the Council with grant funding to do so.

"Can the naming of the road now taken in charge from the Thomas Ashe roundabout to Millbourne be referred to the Civic Commemoration Committee for consideration."

- 9.1.1 Referred to the number of traffic incidents on the Ballybin Road, which was not designed for heavy traffic usage and requested that consideration be given to options to address this.
- 9.1.2 Referred to some confusion arising from the roadwork signs on the Ratoath Road and requested that flagmen be used in the interim.
- 9.2 Councillor Conor Tormey raised the following issue:
 - 9.2.1 Referred to the need for a ramp at the pedestrian crossing at Harlockstown a \$38 process is required for such traffic calming measures.
- 9.3 Councillor Suzanne Jamal raised the following issue:
 - 9.3.1 Requested an update on Oberstown Cross, Skryne the contractor is due to finish up at another site soon and these works will follow. An update will be provided when the programme for remaining works issues.
