

Dear Sirs,

I am one of the Residents in The Haven, Tower Road, Mornington, Co. Meath. Tower Cross is the start/finish area of the proposed Greenway. A Greenway does have merit but I object to the Greenway because it would adversely affect our Estate for the following reasons:-

- 1. Meath County Council expect that a minimum of 900-1000 people will use the Greenway on a daily basis. This will cause an increase of littering and dog fouling in the area.
- 2. Meath County Council have stated that they will not provide car parking facilities. This will present our Estate with problems exiting our Road.
- 3. There are no toilet facilities on the Crook Road and Meath County Council will not provide them. Where do the people go?? Private Gardens or the Sand Dunes which happened during the Covid 19 Pandemic. This would be embarrassing for the walkers and unacceptable for the local public.
- 4. The movement in our immediate vicinity will give rise to increased noise and potential security issues for our own homes and children.

In conclusion, I hope An Bord Pleanála will take on board our very real concerns about the Greenway.
