Meath County Council Arts Office, in partnership with the **Centre Culturel Irlandais Paris**, is pleased to announce: the 2024 artist's residency bursary.

Continuing their partnership for a sixth year,

Centre Culturel Irlandais and Meath County

Council Arts Office will work together to support

an individual artist from Meath to spend a month
in Paris.



Open to practising professional artists of all

disciplines living in County Meath, the bursary will provide: a month-long residency at the prestigious Parisian centre, and include travel from Ireland, accommodation, and a stipend of €800.00 towards expenses.

During the residency, the successful artist will have the opportunity to develop their creative practice and ideas and gain inspiration from being immersed in a new city and culture. Theatre makers, composers, dancers, visual artists, writers, choreographers, researchers and film makers have all benefitted from time spent in Ireland's flagship cultural centre in Europe, leading to a vibrant and creative community.

Previous recipients of the Meath Arts Office sponsored residency include; composer Michael Galen, traditional musician Brenda Castles, composer and musician Christy Leech, actor and writer Fionn Foley and writer Oisín McKenna.

The Centre Culturel Irlandais' annual residency programme offers great opportunities for artists of all disciplines to tap into the resources of the CCI and the city of Paris, as well as being an important means of showcasing Ireland's dynamic contemporary culture on an international stage.

Nature's Way will be available for viewing in the Toradh Gallery 2, Kells Courthouse, Tourism & Cultural Hub until Friday 8th December 2023.




Ashbourne Historical Society Exhibition –

Ashbourne 2020 celebrated the signing of the lease in 1820 for the land on which Frederick Bourne would build a small village with several coaching inns, a small hotel, a toll house and other buildings. He called the village Ashbourne. **The exhibition runs from 15th August 2023 – 8th January 2024.**

Ireland's newest creative collective launches in Meath - MEATH MADE

Meath MADE, Ireland's newest creative collective featuring some of Meath, and Ireland's, best known professional makers, artists and designers has been officially launched. Meath MADE will help to bring awareness to their individual works while also driving business, growth & sales.

According to Meath MADE chairperson Clare O'Connor, internationally known for her luxury wearable art collections, "this is an exciting time for creatives in our county. Meath MADE is a wonderful new collective which was formed this year to provide a platform for the local community and the wider diaspora to access high quality art, craft and design from County Meath."

"With the support of our Local Enterprise Office and Meath County Council we aim to work together to elevate, raise awareness and promote the rich diversity of creativity in Meath," she added.

The decision to form the collective followed more than a year of consultation and input from creators living and working in Meath and it had its genesis in the Local Enterprise Office in Meath which reached out to them mid-2022.

Joe English, Head of Enterprise, Local Enterprise Office Meath, said "every day we get to work with some of Meath's most talented people and now we have the opportunity to do that with Meath MADE."

"It is a unique grouping of artists across the county and another reason for people to look for local and shop local. The LEO team will make all of its supports available including exploring export potential, accessing grants, mentoring and training supports," he added.

The group had its official photoshoot on the Hill of Tara and Anita Reynolds, a textile and ceramic artist, who is Secretary Meath MADE, said, "we are hugely aware of our wonderful history and heritage."

"We believe our Royal County was the home of the first creatives and crafts people in Ireland and we are all very proud of this. Whether it's the visual marks and objects left by our ancestors, the pastoral landscape we live in, the materials we use or the energy that surrounds us in the many magical historic sites like Tara, Loughcrew and Brú na Bóinne, our home is fundamental to us all in our work," she added.

The launch of the collective was warmly welcomed by the Chief Executive of Meath County Council, Fiona Lawless, who said, "we are delighted to support Meath MADE. It is a collective that reminds us of the wonderful talent and history we have in our county and I wish them well in the future."
