Affordable Housing

Meath County Council are offering two new affordable housing schemes.

Effernock, Trim, Co Meath – Offers have issued to 8 successful applicants, 3 have accepted and the remaining 5 have until 21/05/2025 to accept. Reserve list is in place should we have any withdrawals.

Beaufort, Boyne Village, Navan, Co Meath – Currently assessing applications. To date 171 people have logged into the portal to view the details, we have 28 Valid applications for 7 affordable homes. Offers will issue in the coming weeks to successful applicants.

Expressions of Interest

The Housing Department continue to collaborate with Developers and Landowners to purchase land and or properties for the provision of social and affordable housing.

Local Authority Adaptive Work Scheme (LAAWS)

- LAAWS grant funding of €614,789.19 including VAT was submitted for approval to DHLGH on 23rd January 2025.
- This includes 50 disabled persons grant units for €412,289.19 and 3 disabled persons grant extension units for €202,500.00.
- This brings the total to 53nr. LAAWS applications scheduled to be completed in 2025.
- 13nr. LAAWS applications are completed so far this year.

Housing Adaptation Grant Schemes for Older People and People with a Disability

Confirmation of 2025 approved allocation for Housing Adaptation Grants for Older People and Disabled People Scheme received on 9th May 2025 - **€4,343,714** including MCC match funding.

298 applications for the value of €2,104,750.41 were approved up to 15.05.2025

Local Authority Energy Efficiency Retrofit Programme (EERP)

Energy upgrade works are currently ongoing on 9 properties. 48 properties have been approved by the Department for the 2025 EERP Programme.

Local Authority Planned Maintenance

445 Stock Condition Surveys were completed from the 1st January 2025 up to 20th May 2025.

1,548 Inspections were carried out on rented properties in Meath up to the end of April 2025. Of this figure, 476 were first inspections, 19 properties passed after their first inspection. The number of tenancies to be inspected by Meath County Council in 2025 has been set at 1,973 dwellings (each dwelling can only be counted once per calendar year).

Meath Age Friendly

The Healthy Food Made Easy Programme started in the Kells Family Resource Centre on 15th May, which is being provided specifically for members of Meath Older Person's Council. This programme is an 8-week programme on nutritional advice for older people and hands-on experience with healthy cooking for older people.

Members from the Meath's Older Person Council were among 200 older people who attended the National Older Persons Council Convention, hosted by South Dublin County Council on 8-9 May 2025. The theme of this year's convention was 'The Wisdom of Years – A Lifetime of Perspective' and focused on preventive over reactive healthcare, brain health, and intergenerational solidarity as keys to ageing well. Meath Age Friendly will be piloting a new programme, "Security and Safety for Older People in Meath" with the first taster session taking place on 17th June in Athboy Covent Community Centre. An Garda Siochana will be there on the day to provide local information to older people in the area on staying safe and secure in different ways.

Public Participation Network

There are 773 groups are registered with Meath PPN.

Plenary held in Duleek Community Facility on May 29th, with over 50 groups attending. Presentations from the Ombudsman, Community Link Worker, Governance and new Local Community Safety Partnership were given as well as networking and stalls from Sonairte, Wildlife Rehabilitation Ireland and BHP community insurance.

National Conference planning continues, with 4 meetings of the stakeholder's subgroup.

4 excursions and 4 workshops will take place, along with a misinformation session and opportunity for networking.

The nomination to fill the Environment Pillar vacancy on LCDC is an agenda item on the June Council Meeting for approval.

Comhairle na nÓg

The second steering committee meeting of 2025 took place on 13th May 2025. Comhairle na nÓg members have developed a programme around their chosen topic of school stress to be worked on over the remainder of 2025. Currently they are formulating a response to Minister for Education, Helen McEntee on students right to switch off, completing the public consultation on policing priorities, and collaborating with Jigsaw on a mental health stigma reduction campaign. They also recently met with Cormac Ross, Meath County Council Senior Executive Engineer regarding the Navan 2030 project, with specific reference to Trimgate Street.

Carranstown Environmental Projects Grant Scheme

Funding recommendations for the Carranstown Environment Projects Grant Scheme 2024 were presented to the Laytown-Bettystown MD Members for approval at their meeting on 15th May and will go to Full Council for approval at their June meeting.


Local Authority Integration Team (LAIT)

The conference theme was 'The Wisdom of Years, a Lifetime of Perspective'. Speakers included Kieran O'Donnell TD (Minister for Older People), Professor Ronan Collins (Tallaght University Hospital), Moyagh Murdock (Insurance Ireland), Mike Hanrahan (musician) and Meath Co Council's Chief Executive Kieran Kehoe. A special consultation workshop on the Department of Rural and Community Development's new Rural Policy discussed challenges and opportunities for older people in rural areas. Delegates attended site visits to Age Friendly housing at The Weir, a walkability audit of Tallaght Stadium, and an active ageing exercise class, among others.

Minister Kieran O'Donnell visited four nursing homes in Counties Roscommon and Leitrim on 28th May to launch the new Community Linkage Project that will bring more community-based services and volunteering supports to people living in residential care. This initiative will benefit 200 nursing home residents over an 18 month period. Training has been provided for the staff champions assigned in the nine participating nursing homes.

Through a partnership with larnród Éireann/Irish Rail, Ballybrophy Train Station in County Laois received Age Friendly recognition on 2nd May. Ballybrophy is the second station in Ireland to receive recognition. It is one of ten stations that Irish Rail are prioritising this year to future proof for ageing. The station now has Age Friendly car parking spaces, wheelchair accessible spaces and accompanying signage available on platform seating and waiting areas, and accessible toilets. Age Friendly Ambassador for Laois Anna May McHugh attended the event.

A walkability audit took place of Cavan General Hospital, one of the first steps towards making the hospital Age Friendly. Cavan is following the recent example of Monaghan Hospital, using the guidelines developed with St Luke's Hospital in Kilkenny.

Under the National Technical Programme, Age Friendly Housing & Public Realm training was delivered to Limerick City and County Council staff on 28th May and Cavan County Council staff on 16th May.

Age Friendly Ireland participated in two in-person stakeholders engagement sessions on 20th and 26th May on Policing Priorities for An Garda Síochána organised by the Policing and Community Safety Authority.

A pilot programme has been launched in County Meath to develop an Age Friendly Workplace Recognition Programme. A stakeholder day took place on 29th May in Bellinter House Hotel with businesses from across Meath to hear their ideas on how to develop working environments that support older workers. A wide array of businesses took part including Bus Eireann, Emerald Park, Insurance Ireland, and Age Action. The guest speaker was from the Centre for Ageing Better in the UK.

The shared service made submissions in May in relation to the National Housing Plan, the Protection of Liberty Safeguards, and the Rural Safety Plan.

The National Age Friendly Recognition Awards are open for applications until 6th June.

A bespoke Age Friendly Communication Training Programme has been delivered to nursing home staff in 18 residential units across Donegal, Sligo, Leitrim, Cavan and Monaghan. The programme trained 63 champions who will now go on to train their staff teams. The training content was developed by Age Friendly Ireland, based on interview material with residents of the nursing homes.

The annual Age Friendly Sports Day will take place on 25th September in the National Indoor Arena and will include Tai Chi, Cycling, Trishaws, Park Run, Cricket for All, Walking Football, Fitstix and an active class with weights.

Age Friendly Business training was delivered to 39 participants in 4 training courses from February to May, including Credit Unions (across the country), FBD, Hidden Hearing and Tírlan.

Age Friendly Ireland is participating in a special 'Housing for Older People' policy group chaired by Minister O'Donnell.

Training has been provided for Fire Officers & Local Coordinators for the Home Fire Safety Visit Collaboration between Healthy Age Friendly Homes and Sligo Fire Service, Leitrim Fire Service. The Community Fire team has devised a home fire safety checklist to include checks on electrical safety, night-time routine, drying clothes, cooking/smoking advice. A referral form has been developed and direct referral from HAFH Local Coordinators into the Fire Service was identified. Two Fire Officers call to older people's homes to carry out home fire safety checks and install smoke alarms. A Protocol of Collaboration agreement is now in place for this initiative.

EcoGrow Campaign



The EcoGrow Initiative is starting on Saturday, May 17th and will run an event in each Decarbonising Zone until the end of May. The initiative will include workshops to teach attendees how to create and use compost from food waste, how to grow their own food using spring plants, allowing them hands-on experience of the same. They will also be taught how to make fertilizer from kitchen resources, the principals of biodiversity, the importance of native plants, sustainable garden practices which encourage biodiversity and habitat diversity in garden design.

EPA data shows: The average Irish household throws out 150 kg of food waste each year: at a cost of approximately €700. Food waste in landfill breaks down to methane gas which is a potent Greenhouse Gas.

EcoGrow is Meath County Councils initiative to help the public learn more about how you can use food waste for eco-friendly gardening to grow your own food. The outcome from this project will be the reduction in volumes of food waste to landfill.

Blue Flag and Green Coast Awards 2025

Meath Beaches received three prestigious Awards at the An Taisce Blue Flag and Green Coast Award Ceremony. The awards were presented by Mr. James Browne TD – Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage at the presentation ceremony held in the Ravenport Resort in Curracloe, County Wexford on May 19th. Speaking at the ceremony, Minister Browne, who presented the award flags noted "Given that the Blue Flag programme is an internationally recognised symbol of high standards in water quality, environmental management, environmental education and safety, I am honoured to present a record number of awards today – 99 Blue Flags and 70 Green Coast Awards."

Meath received a Blue Flag for Bettystown Beach and two Green Coast Awards for Bettystown and Mornington Beaches.



Green Schools 2025

Twenty-five Meath schools received their Green Flag at the Green Schools Awards in Dundalk on Wednesday 21st May. St. Patricks Classical School received their 'Water' Flag together with St Ciarans Community School, Kells and Ratoath College. Five schools received their Litter and Waste Flag – Loreto Secondary, Dunshaughlin Community College, Enfield Community College, Colaiste Ríoga Dunshaughlin. Franciscan College Gormanston, Ashbourne Educate Together, Coláiste Pobail Rathcairn, Scoil Naomh Bríde Trim and St Marys National School Enfield received their Travel Flag. Biodiversity Flags were awarded to Navan Educate Together, Duleek Boys National School, St Stephens National School Johnstown and Gilson National School Oldcastle. Global Citizenship Flags were awarded to Carrickleck N.S., Scoil Oilibheir Naofa Kilcloon, Kilmessan N.S., Castletown Kilpatrick N.S., Kilbride N.S. Trim, St Joseph's N.S., Scoil Colmcille Skryne, Scoil Mhuire Moylagh and St Patricks N.S. Slane.

Green Schools is a whole school environmental awareness, action and award scheme, known internationally as Eco-Schools, that promotes long-term, whole-school action for the environment. It

is undertaken by sixteen million students in 82 countries around the world. In Ireland it is managed by An Taisce with support from Local Authorities. The program helps schools reduce waste, conserve energy and water, and increase environmental awareness.



Water Quality Update

Our Farm inspection programme is ongoing in the Nanny, Delvin, Martry, Kilmainham (Dee), Dee and Stoneyford catchments; pre-inspection letters have been issued, and inspections are underway.

Meath County Council are currently participating in a pilot programme regarding notified movements of organic fertilisers as part of the National Agricultural Inspection Programme working group.

Coastal Protection Update

Our Environment Dept and our Consultants RPS Ireland Ltd presented an update on the 'Meath Coastal Flooding and Erosion Risk Management' Study to the Laytown Bettystown MD at the May meeting.

Issues raised by the Members at the meeting will be taken on board in the study which is due for completion in June 2025.

Libraries Services and Arts Office



Navan Library Book Club earns Special Merit Award at KPMG Children's Books Ireland Awards 2025



The *Stay Up All Night Book Club* was set up in Navan Library in September 2023 in collaboration with the Louth Meath Branch of Down Syndrome Ireland. The young adults attend monthly meetings in the library which is facilitated by two dedicated library staff members. They have developed a successful and creative format for the club, resourcing a wide range of reading material and supplemental tailored resources including video, music and art to engage the club members each month.

As part of this year's programme the book club participated in the KPMG Children's Books Ireland Awards Junior Juries' Programme, a unique activity for schools, libraries and book clubs, designed to encourage children and young people to read widely and to engage with reading in an innovative and exciting way. At the recent KPMG Children's Books Ireland Book Awards ceremony, the achievements of the club were awarded a Special Merit Award.

The group travelled by bus to the ceremony in Merrion Square where they were joined by Sinéad Flynn from Down Syndrome Ireland's Adult Education Department. Each member received a €50

book voucher and a special mention from the KPMG representative on stage. They were interviewed by RTÉ Junior Radio who broadcast the interviews on Monday, 26th May. They also met award-winning authors whose books they had read as part of the Junior Juries programme, two of whom have agreed to visit the book club later in the year.

The group enjoyed the experience, and it should encourage them to continue their reading journey as part of the book club.

Europe Day

Diversity, creativity, and culture were celebrated across Meath Library service during May, as part of Europe Day celebrations 2025. Funded by the Department of Foreign Affairs Communicating Europe Initiative, a variety of events were designed to foster awareness in our young EU citizens of their place in the EU.

Children put their knowledge to the test in an exciting series of table quizzes, the sessions were brought to life by fun and vibrant musical interludes celebrating the anthems of Europe with musician Caithríona Madden. Young people were invited to test their Lego engineering skills while building iconic European landmarks; explore European identity with A Passport to Europe art and creativity workshop and take part in multilingual story times and craft sessions.

Many of these story times were facilitated by library staff each from their own diverse cultural background. These story sessions introduced children to new languages, sounds and traditions, while fostering cultural appreciation and inclusion in our local communities.

Creative Ireland: Cruinniú na nÓg



Funded by the Creative Ireland Programme, Cruinniú na nÓg is a national day of free creative activity for children and young people. In 2024, over 1,800 children participated in Meath Cruinniú na nÓg events.

The programme will also include a special morning of events in Mosney Accommodation Centre for the children living there, delivered in collaboration with Louth County Council.

All events have been thoughtfully designed following a consultation process with children and young people, ensuring that the programme reflects their voices, interests, and creative aspirations. The result is a diverse and engaging schedule that promotes inclusivity, imagination, and active participation.

Belfast TradFest new All-Ireland Residential Bursary Scheme – Meath Bursary

New in 2025, the **Meath Bursary is a cross border partnership** as part of the recently announced **Belfast TradFest new All-Ireland Residential Bursary Scheme for young traditional musicians**. The scheme offers fully funded places at its traditional music summer school, taking place from 28 July to 1 August 2025. It is open to applicants aged 18–23 residing in both Northern Ireland and, for the first time, the Republic of Ireland. The summer school provides an intensive week of masterclasses, workshops, performances and sessions. Based at Ulster University's campus in Belfast, the programme will be taught by leading traditional artists including fiddle player Kevin Burke, singer Iarla Ó Lionáird, Scottish harpist Catriona McKay, Shetland fiddle player Chris Stout, singer Cathy Jordan, tin whistle player Mary Bergin, fiddle player Zoë Conway, and guitarist John Doyle. This cross border scheme aims to support one participant from each county on the island of Ireland and covers tuition fees, accommodation, meals and full access to the programme of afternoon events. To apply, applicants must demonstrate a strong commitment to learning and contributing to traditional music.
